



## Allan Brooks Nature Trailer Overview

Allan Brooks Nature Centre is pleased to offer our Nature Trailer program to your school! Using our mobile display unit in combination with interactive games and activities, we provide a hands-on nature-based experience for your students right in your schoolyard.

Four outdoor programs (K-1, 2-3, 4-5, and 6-7) detailed below, have been developed in accordance with the new BC curriculum. Programs range from 45 - 60 min, depending on bell times. The program is available December through March. Indoor programming is also available in the case of severe winter weather.

Pricing: \$125 base fee plus \$75 per class (minimum of 3 classes). *Travel fees may be charged beyond a 15km radius of the Nature Centre.*

### **Grade K/1: Adapting to Seasonal Changes**

Through role-playing, activities and games, discover how animals meet their basic needs of food, water and shelter throughout the seasons. Take the opportunity to touch and feel the furs of local wildlife who use streams and wetlands.

### **Grade 2/3: Lifecycles and Biodiversity of Wetlands**

Trace the flow of rainfall as it makes its way to wetlands with a hands-on demonstration of our watershed model. Meet a diverse group of creatures that depend on wetlands for survival and learn about their lifecycles.

### **Grade 4/5: A Sense of Survival**

Learn how animals sense and interact with each other and their environment, and discover how all life is interconnected. Participate in a web of life activity and play games to explore how animals use their senses to survive.

### **Grade 6/7: Survival of the Fittest in a Changing Climate**

As British Columbia's climate changes, there will be winners and losers amongst our plant and wildlife species. Using interactive scenarios, explore how various species may be challenged by climate change or how they might be adapted to be one of the survivors.
