SCHOOL PROGRAMS Fall is a busy time for us here at Allan Brooks Nature Centre, as students head back to the classrooms to

start another year of learning! It is our goal to ensure that this also includes getting outside and hands-on in our local environment!

In September and October, classes are welcome to visit us at ABNC for a Field Trip, and they are also invited to join us at Coldstream Creek to welcome the spawning Kokanee Salmon. The Kokanee Salmon program runs for 1 hour and 45 minutes at the creek's edge. Students get to experience the salmon run, while learning about their unique lifecycle through

interactive discussions and games. In addition, we are running the Stream Science program for local high school students. This is a water quality monitoring program, where high school students test the water quality of their local creek or stream. This is a very engaging and fun program run at a local river, and

gives students a closer look at what may be affecting our local water quality.
